

## Moorman Garners Humanitarian Award

**Riverwoods, IL** - Pro Football Weekly announces in this week's paper that Buffalo Bills P Brian Moorman is the recipient of the seventh annual Pro Football Weekly Arthur S. Arkush Humanitarian Award, presented to a NFL player whose contributions to the community and charitable organizations are especially outstanding.

Moorman, 29, is not only one of the top punters in the NFL on the field, but he is one of the Bills' most admired and respected players off the field for his dedication to the community. He generously supports the many organizations and agencies connected with the team while also selflessly giving of his time to help children, especially children with cancer.

He also has established The PUNT Foundation, whose mission is to support pediatric cancer research, treatment and social programs. He and his wife, Amber, make regular visits to the Roswell Park Cancer Institute to visit children with cancer and his events help benefit Carly's Club and the programs they provide for families affected by cancer.

He hosts two major events each year - the Turf Jam Celebrity Karaoke event and Carly's Club's Halloween Party - where he enlists teammates to join in the cause. Moorman has also been a spokesperson for the Bills' reading program, helped habitat for humanity and regularly helps serve the annual thanksgiving lunch at buffalo city mission.

He also raises money for his foundation through the Dunlop Tires Kicking for a Cure, in which money is donated for every punt he places inside the opponent's 20-yard line through the season.

Moorman was one of five finalists for this year's Humanitarian Award. The other finalists were Ryan Pontbriand of the Browns, Robert Thomas of the Rams, Roy Williams of the Cowboys and Grant Wistrom of the Seahawks.

The award is named in honor of Arthur S. Arkush, the founder of Pro Football Weekly.
